2022 AMP Livestock Expo Points System

Point System Rubric:

Live Animal Evaluation – Conducted by a judge evaluating the quality of livestock. (0 pts)

This portion of the AMP Livestock Expo will determine the non-monetary awards based on placing of livestock.

Showmanship – Showmanship will be evaluated by an independent judge. (20 pts)

Blue Ribbon = 20 pts	White Ribbon = 5 pts
Red Ribbon = 10 pts	Green Ribbon = 0 pts

SAE Report – Use of the Agriculture Experience Tracker recordkeeping system (www.theaet.com) (20 pts)

**SAE Report will include goals, expenses, income, journal hours and pictures.*

20 pts = All components of the SAE Report	8 pts = A SAE report missing three components
16 pts = A SAE report missing one component	4 pts = A SAE Report missing four components
12 pts = A SAE report missing two components	0 pts = No SAE Report submitted

Management – Daily management of the livestock project (25 pts)

Pen Cleanliness / Daily Feeding (10 pts) will be based on which rating the student receives the most often during weekly assessments.

Excellent = 10 pts	Above Expectations = 7 pts	Meets Expectations = 3 pts
Below Expectations = 0 pts		

Project Center Workdays/Chores (10 pts)

100% participation in workdays/chores = 10 pts	50% participation in workdays/chores = 5 pts
75% participation in workdays/chores = 7.5 pts	< 50% participation in workdays/chores = 0 pts

Weekly Livestock Project Feedback (5 pts)

100 % participation in weekly feedback = 5 pts	< 75 % participation in weekly feedback = 0 pts
75 % participation in weekly feedback = 2.5 pts

Project Inspection Reports / Violations

Students will receive feedback with a *Project Inspection Report* or *Project/Barn Violation*. A *Project Inspection Report* will be used to communicate periodic project evaluation ratings and management information. A *Project/Barn Violation* will be used to notify a student of a major infraction regarding project management, behavior, or clerical expectations. The student will be **deducted 2 points** each time a *Project/Barn Violation* is issued.

Point System Qualifications:

1. A student that earns less than **50 points** from the point system rubric will not be eligible to participate in a livestock experience for the next year at the AMP Livestock Expo.
2. A student must earn a minimum of **50 points** from the point system rubric to qualify for any potential premium monies awarded by the James Madison FFA Booster Club.
3. A student must earn a minimum of **70 points** from the point system rubric to be considered for the major show level the next year. The following components will also be used to determine the final eligibility of a student to participate at the major show level:
 - A. The student and parent(s)/guardian(s) must interview with the project supervisor of the species of interest.
 - B. The student must receive a positive recommendation from the project supervisor that supervised the student for the AMP Livestock Expo.

After the conclusion of the AMP Livestock Expo, livestock project supervisors will calculate the points earned by individual livestock exhibitors using the Point System Rubric. Livestock project supervisors will make this information available to livestock exhibitors once it is completed. Points payout will be determined using the following formula per species:

- Rabbits
 - Total number of points earned times a multiplier of 1
- Goats
 - Total number of points earned times a multiplier of 2.67
- Lambs
 - Total number of points earned times a multiplier of 2.67
- Swine
 - Total number of points earned times a multiplier of 2.67

Livestock exhibitors that earn at minimum 50 points using the Point System Rubric will have the above multipliers applied to their point total according to the specie of livestock they exhibited. The total number of points generated after the multiplier is applied will be used as the denominator in the following equation to determine the value per point:

$$\frac{\text{Total Funds Budgeted by the JMFFA Booster Club}}{\text{Total Number of Points Generated}} = \text{Dollar Value per Point}$$

2022 North East Ag Fair General Rules

1. Only students in good standing with the Agriscience Magnet Program (AMP) and enrolled in at least one semester of an AMP course during the 2022 – 2023 school year may participate.
2. All students must pay FFA dues and be in good financial standing with the AMP to participate.
3. All students that participate in the AMP Livestock Expo must be academically eligible at the time of the Livestock Expo to exhibit a project.
4. The NEISD AMP staff shall assume no responsibility for loss of life or harmful cause to an animal or student, whether manmade or acts of nature.
5. All livestock must be housed on the AMP Complex facilities.
6. Eligible students may compete in the following divisions of the AMP Livestock Expo:
 - Market Goats
 - Market Rabbits
 - Market Lambs
 - Market Swine
7. Each participant is responsible for seeing that his/her animal is properly cared for before, during, and after the show. Any violation will result in the removal of the participant's animal from competition or AMP Complex, forfeiture of any premium money, or barring said participant from further livestock competitions.
 - The Livestock Project Supervisor (AMP Staff) is responsible for helping students manage the health and well-being of livestock.
8. No medication should be administered to any livestock animal without the knowledge of the appropriate Livestock Project Supervisor.
9. Livestock with external parasites at the time of the show will not be allowed to be exhibited.
10. All livestock must be clipped and/or groomed by the exhibitor, the exhibitor's parents, or AMP staff. No artificial coloring may be used on any species. Students should perform as much of the work as possible, as this is part of their personal learning experience.
11. The AMP Livestock Expo will be held during the month of October.
12. AMP Livestock Expo judge(s) will be secured by members of the AMP staff and all judges' decisions will be deemed final and beyond contestation.
13. All participants must show their own livestock project; substitutions will be allowed only at the discretion of the AMP staff.
14. The number of animal classes and the weight breaks will be determined by the AMP staff after official show weights have been recorded. The weight breaks will be posted for students in the corresponding project centers prior to the show.
15. Participants and/or parents are not to become argumentative, openly hostile or act in any threatening manner toward show judges, AMP staff, other students and/or parents, or any NEISD representatives as a result of decisions made during the livestock show competition. Violations of this policy, whether by a student or parent, may result in disqualification of the exhibitor and banishment from future participation in livestock competitions or the Agriscience Magnet Program.
16. Concerns and/or suggestions regarding the AMP Livestock Expo must be submitted to an AMP staff member in writing, signed by the originator, no later than October 31st following the show to be considered for the next year.

Market Goats

1. Entry Fee: \$20.00 per market goat entry.
2. Entry Deadline: **October 14, 2022.**
3. Breeds: Goats will be secured from a single source breeder by the AMP staff and exhibitors will select their goat using a random draw system. Only goats secured from a single source breeder for exhibition in the AMP Livestock Expo may compete.
4. Weight: The minimum weight is 50 pounds and there will be a five (5) pound tolerance at official weigh-in. There is no maximum weight limit.
5. Classes: Goats will be divided into weight classes as deemed necessary after official weigh-in.
6. Grooming: Goats must be shorn slick, with no indication of blocking, to the skin above the knee and hock joints to include the head, excluding the tail switch. Unshorn goats will not be exhibited.
7. Fitting: Foreign material including painting, powdering, artificial coloring is prohibited.
8. Guidelines: Exhibitors may show their goats with chains, collars, or halters.
9. Showmanship: All exhibitors must compete in the showmanship class to earn points for the Showmanship category of the Points System Rubric.

Market Lambs

1. Entry Fee: \$20.00 per market lamb entry.
2. Entry Deadline: **October 14, 2022.**
3. Breeds: Lambs will be secured from a single source breeder by the AMP staff and exhibitors will select their lamb using a random draw system. Only lambs secured from a single source breeder for exhibition in the AMP Livestock Expo may compete.
4. Weight: The minimum weight is 75 pounds and there will be a five (5) pound tolerance at official weigh-in. There is no maximum weight limit.
5. Classes: Lambs will be divided into weight classes as deemed necessary after official weigh-in.
6. Grooming: All lambs must be slick sheared to the skin above knee and hock joints, with no more than ¼ inch wool in length on the day of the show.
7. Drenching: No pumping of water or liquids via oral tube into the stomach. Drench guns are allowed.
8. Showmanship: All exhibitors must compete in the showmanship class to earn points for the Showmanship category of the Points System Rubric.

Market Rabbits

1. Entry Fee: \$20.00 per
2. Entry Deadline: **October 14, 2022.**
3. Breeds: Rabbits will be secured from a single source breeder by the AMP staff and exhibitors will select their rabbit using a random draw system. Only rabbits secured from a single source breeder for exhibition in the AMP Livestock Expo may compete. Entry will consist of one rabbit.
4. Weight: The minimum weight on fryers is 3.5 pounds each and a maximum weight is 5.5 pounds.
5. Showmanship: All exhibitors must compete in the showmanship class to earn points for the Showmanship category of the Points System Rubric. Rabbit showmanship may consist of a written exam and/or hands on demonstrations.

Market Swine

1. Entry Fee: \$20.00 per market swine entry.
2. Entry Deadline: **October 14, 2022.**
3. Breeds: Swine will be secured from a single source breeder by the AMP staff and exhibitors will select their swine using a random draw system. Only swine secured from a single source breeder for exhibition in the AMP Livestock Expo may compete.
4. Weight: The minimum weight is 150 pounds and there will be a ten (10) pound tolerance at official weigh-in. There is no maximum weight limit.
5. Classes: Swine will be divided into weight classes as deemed necessary after official weigh-in.
6. Grooming: No powder, oil, etc. may be used on swine when exhibited in the show ring.
7. Showmanship: All exhibitors must compete in the showmanship class to earn points for the Showmanship category of the Points System Rubric.
